An MOU Cross-Border Services was developed by the Registrar's Committee of the Canadian Alliance of Physiotherapy Regulators (CAPR) to enable cross border physiotherapy in specific circumstances. All provincial jurisdictions have signed the MOU and are in different stages of implementation. The Ministry of Health has recently approved a Regulatory Bylaw amendment to include a new licence called Extended Access Licence. We are in the process of amending our registration processes to include registration for an Extended Access Licence.

The specific circumstances where an Extended Access Licence would be required are:

- (a) for the purpose of continuing to provide patient care to patients whose physiotherapy began in the primary jurisdiction and who would benefit from continued and time-limited service in the secondary jurisdiction; or
- (b) where services are not otherwise available in the secondary jurisdiction and the patient would benefit from such services.

"Primary jurisdiction" means the other Canadian jurisdiction in which the member is currently registered and in which the majority of their practice is physically situated. "Secondary jurisdiction" means Saskatchewan.

The MOU is now operational in AB, SK, MB, ON, QC, NB, NS. If you plan on providing extended services in one of these jurisdictions you will need to apply for an extended access licence in that province.
